Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

To provide a source of monthly income, with the potential for long term growth through capital appreciation and growth in dividends by investing primarily in common shares, convertible debentures and other equity related securities of U.S. issuers. The Fund will attempt to produce a total return (net of fees) from the combination of dividends, growth in dividends, and capital appreciation that is in excess of the return of the S&P 500 Index, and secondarily, the Russell 1000 Value Index over a full market cycle.

The strategy employs a value approach to the management of equities. The Fund will generally reflect the following value characteristics: price/earnings and price/book ratios at, or below the market (S&P 500 Index); a dividend yield at, or above the market; and the majority of common shares held by the Fund will have a 25-year history of paying cash dividends. The Fund is sub-advised by Barrow, Hanley, Mewhinney & Strauss, LLC ("Barrow Hanley") of Dallas, Texas.

Risk

The overall risks of investing in the Fund are as described in the Simplified Prospectus. There were no material changes to the Fund during the year that affected the overall level of risk.

Results of Operations

The Fund's net assets decreased by 5.9% in the first half of 2023 to \$17.4 million (in US dollars) from \$18.5 million (in US dollars) at the end of 2022. Of this change, \$0.2 million was attributed to negative investment performance and \$0.9 million to net outflows from unitholders.

In the first half of 2023, the US Dividend Equity Fund Series A decreased by 1.0% before fees, and Series B and F decreased by 1.7% and 1.5% respectively, after fees and expenses. The S&P 500 (U\$) increased 16.9% over the same period.

The Leith Wheeler US Dividend Fund seeks to provide a source of monthly income, with the potential for long-term growth through capital appreciation and growth in dividends by investing primarily in common shares, convertible debentures, and other equity-related securities of US issuers.

2023 started off on a positive note for markets but volatility returned with two significant events occurring in early March. The first was crypto-focused bank Silvergate Capital announcing that it was shutting down its operations. The second was Silicon Valley Bank ("SVB") coming to market to raise capital after it had been forced to sell a large portion of their available-for-sale securities at a loss. This triggered panic in the US financial system, which put other regional banks under pressure and ultimately led to the demise of SVB.

The second quarter of 2023 ended with most markets around the globe higher than where they started, with the US market propelled higher by the large technology companies that drove performance in the first quarter. It is remarkable that an index as large as the S&P 500 is now dominated by a handful of companies. In fact, Facebook (Meta), Apple, Amazon, Netflix, Google (Alphabet), Microsoft, NVIDIA, and Tesla have accounted for over 80% of the index returns this year. Against this backdrop, our US portfolios have struggled to keep pace with the market.

The Fund underperformed relative to the S&P 500 Index in the first half of 2023. While portfolio holdings performed well, the Fund underperformed its index primarily due to its underweight in the information technology sector. Stock selection in the energy sector has also detracted slightly from performance so far this year.

Recent Developments

In July 2023, the S&P 500 (U\$) rose +3.2%.

Related Party Transactions

Leith Wheeler Investment Counsel Ltd. (the "Manager") is the manager and portfolio advisor of the Fund and is responsible for the Fund's day-to-day operations. The Fund pays the Manager a management fee as compensation for managing the investment portfolio of the Fund.

Management Fees

The Manager provides the Fund with investment management services, including fund accounting and unitholder record keeping. In return, the Manager receives a management fee based on the net assets of the Fund, calculated on a daily basis. The annualized management fee is 1.25% for the Series B and 0.95% for Series F units of the Fund. During the year, the Fund paid the Manager \$20 for Series B and \$189 for Series F (exclusive of GST/HST) of its net assets as management fees. The Fund does not reimburse the Manager for operating costs incurred in administering the Fund. The Manager paid all operating expenses except brokerage commissions, transaction charges and taxes. In respect of Series A units, the unitholder pays the Manager a negotiated management fee outside the Fund.

We do not directly or indirectly pay fees, sales commissions or trailing commissions, nor do we provide any non-monetary benefits to registered dealers for distributions of units of the Fund. If a broker charges you a commission or fee, that is a matter between you and the dealer.

⁽⁴⁾ The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

Past Performance


General
